PHILCONGEN LA CONDUCTS OUTREACH MISSION IN BAKERSFIELD, CA

21 October 2024, Los Angeles – The Philippine Consulate General in Los Angeles conducted a consular outreach mission in Bakersfield, California from 18 to 19 October 2024. Over the two-day mission, the team rendered a total of 301 services to overseas Filipinos living in Bakersfield and nearby cities, as well as those from other states.

The outreach team rendered various services, which included passport, dual citizenship, notarial and civil registry services, as well as assistance to nationals.
